

Details about the exhibition area of FLIGHT OF DREAMS

Central Japan International Airport is happy to announce new details about the Exhibition Area of FLIGHT OF DREAMS, the new commercial complex with the first-ever Boeing 787 Dreamliner in its centre, expected to open on October 12th.

1. FLIGHT OF DREAMS official logo

FLIGHT OF DREAMS official logo has been decided, it is a creation of the international design office 'nendo'.

Design Concept

The logo is a panel composition representing the Boeing 787 flying over three areas: sea, mountain and city. The spaciousness of the logo wants to convey a feeling of openness and wellbeing.



2. The exhibition area

The official names for FLIGHT OF DREAMS areas have been decided: the exhibition area is 'FLIGHT PARK' and the commercial area is 'SEATTLE TERRACE'. FLIGHT PARK, the area with the first Boeing 787 (ZA001) Dreamliner in its centre, will be composed of 9 experiential activities.

FLIGHT PARK exhibitions

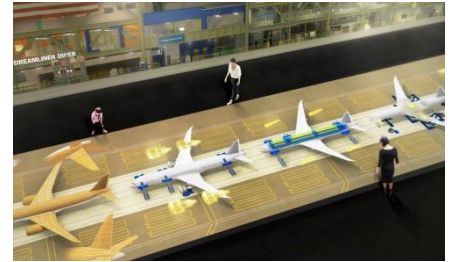
1. Fly with 787 Dreamliner

From the 4th floor viewing area, visitors can enjoy a dynamic light and sound show utilizing the space surrounding the 787 airplane. This show will make the walls and floors dissolve and the real space disappear, feeling like flying with the airplane.



2. Boeing Factory

Here visitors can experience being in the Everett Factory, the world biggest airplane assembly factory, and learn about assembly process from the transportation of the airplane pieces from all over the world by Dream Lifter, a large-sized cargo.



3. Paper Plane Music Field

This interactive exhibition is made to increase curiosity through play, here visitors can make a paper airplane and fly it in an illuminated space. When the paper plane touches the light, the colour of the space will change and create sounds. In this interactive exhibition participants can enjoy the different lights and the sounds with other people.



4. Sketch Airplane

In Sketch Airplane participants can draw an airplane, scan it and make it fly in 3D on a dome space. In addition, the airplane can be piloted with a special tablet. This interactive exhibition has the purpose of creating an interest in piloting while having fun.



5. Airline Studio

Here visitors enter an imaginary world where they can experience airline in-cabin jobs. Videos and pictures can be taken while experiencing working on a plane.

6. ZA001 Flight Deck

In Fly Deck participants will be able to see the inside of the Boeing 787 ZA001 cockpit. Visiting this reproduction of the real cockpit feels like really entering a pilot compartment.



7. 787 Dreamliner Explorer

How do airplanes fly? In this interactive exhibition visitors can use a smartphone application to look for airplane pieces around the Boeing 787. A reference illustration of the 787 will be completed when all the pieces are found.



8. The Museum of Flight Learning Center

This interactive exhibition is part of the Seattle Museum of Flight, world's biggest aerospace museum, STEM education program. The acronym STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics. Participants will be able to learn about aviation and other important fields through handicraft and experiment while having fun.



9. 787 Simulator

This simulator is a reproduction of the real Boeing 787 cockpit where participants can try to pilot a 787 following the instructor's guide.



3. BOEING STORE

BOEING STORE is the official store for Boeing goods that has 14 locations in U.S. being FLIGHT OF DREAMS its first location outside of the U.S. This store will have around 500 items including products directly imported from U.S. and original Boeing merchandising only available in this store.

In addition, some of the goods are real airplane parts reutilized for furniture and art pieces, a must have for airplane fans.
