

## "Tourist Information & Service" closure announcement

Central Japan International Airport Co., Ltd. announces the closure on March 31, 2021 of the tourist promotion facility "Tourist Information & Service" located in the Arrival Lobby on the 2nd floor of Terminal 1.

"Tourist Information & Service" has been providing information on businesses that are actively working on the "Shoryudou Project", a tourist promotion project that started in 2012 in order to attract international tourists to nine prefectures in central Japan. To support this project, a "Shoryudou Tourist Information Center" targeting foreign visitors was opened in October 2014, later on it expanded the services provided and renewed the current Tourist Information & Service. Since the renewal, it has been disseminating the charm of Central Japan to more than 260,000 foreign tourists.

Due to a significant decrease in airport users due to the spread of COVID infection from last year, this facility has been temporarily closed since April 8, 2020. Since we are consider reorganizing the tourist information in the airport in the future, Tourist Information & Service will be closed on March 31st. In the future, tourist information for foreigners visiting Japan at Centrair will be provided mainly at the Central Japan Travel Center, located in the arrival lobby on the 2nd floor of Terminal 1, and at MEITETSU Tourist Information Center Central Japan International Airport, located in Access Plaza which provides information on MEITETSU transportation in foreign languages.
